# Volunteer Application Form Weed Eradication Program

### Weed Eradication Program (WEP)

The Lord Howe Island Board (LHIB) has been implementing an ambitious, island-wide program to eradicate priority weed species since 2004. Invasive weeds are identified as one of the most serious threats to Lord Howe Island's biodiversity and World Heritage values. WEP field teams are responsible for grid-searching every square metre of accessible terrain on the island to search for and control invasive weed species. Volunteers work alongside LHIB bush regeneration staff undertaking this work and are rewarded with experiencing Lord Howe Island off the beaten track and contributing to a project of national and global significance.

#### **Volunteer Placements**

We are currently seeking applications from candidates with relevant bush regeneration experience and a high level of bush fitness for volunteer intakes over June-August 2024

Volunteers must be able to make a 4-week commitment, working Monday to Friday 7:00AM – 3:30PM, with occasional remote days in the southern mountains extending to 5.30pm. The program is highly physical and covers remote and rugged mountain terrain. Persons must be able and willing to work in exposed situations, on steep uneven ground, at elevation, in dense shrubland and in all weather conditions.

In return, the LHIB can offer successful candidates free accommodation, a basic food allowance (\$30/day) and return airfares (Sydney, Port Macquarie, Newcastle or Gold Coast).

Volunteers will need to provide their own work clothing and gear (boots, long sleeve shirt & work trousers, hat, wet weather gear, backpack, hydration pack, head torch). Weeding tools will be provided by the LHIB.
